

# Flu and COVID 2024 - Partnership Pack

To reduce the pressure on hospitals this winter, it's important that people get their annual flu and COVID autumn booster vaccines.

Flu can be a serious or life-threatening illness, especially for those most at risk.

The COVID-19 and flu vaccine can:

- help reduce your risk of getting severe symptoms
- help you recover more quickly if you catch a respiratory infection such as COVID-19 or flu
- help reduce your risk of having to go to hospital or dying from COVID-19 or flu
- protect against different types of COVID and flu virus

## Who is eligible for a flu vaccine?

You can get the free NHS flu vaccine if you:

- are aged 65 or over (including those who will be 65 by 31 March 2025)
- · have certain long-term health conditions
- are pregnant
- school children aged from Reception to Year 11
- live in a care home
- are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance
- live with someone who has a weakened immune system
- Social care staff without an employer-led occupational health scheme

### Who is eligible for a COVID vaccine?

You may be offered a COVID-19 vaccine if you:

- are aged 65 or over
- are pregnant
- are aged 6 months to 64 years and have an increased risk of getting seriously ill from COVID-19 because of a health condition or treatment
- live in a care home for older adults
- frontline health and social care workers
- staff working in care homes for older adults

#### **TIMESCALES**

- Delivery started in September for pregnant women and school children (flu vaccine)
- For other cohorts the main flu campaign started on 3<sup>rd</sup> October with main bulk of delivery to be completed before 31 December 2024
- School children completed by 13<sup>th</sup> December
- Care homes completed by 6<sup>th</sup> December
- COVID by 31<sup>st</sup> January 2025
- Both vaccinations can be given at the same time if people are eligible for both.

#### **HOW CAN YOU SUPPORT THE CAMPAIGN?**


Our aim is to increase the take-up from last year, especially in areas of lower vaccine coverage and amongst groups where we have previously seen lower vaccine uptake.

This includes the Pakistani community, White Any other including Eastern Europeans and in specific areas such as East Staffordshire, Cannock, Stafford and areas of Newcastle-under-Lyme.

There is no pork derived or other animal derived products in the flu or COVID needle vaccine. However, the nasal spray used for children does contain a pork gelatine. An alternative needle vaccine can be taken instead.

You can now get the free NHS flu vaccine if you:

- are aged 65 or over
- have certain long-term health conditions
- are pregnant
- live in a care home
- are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer's allowance
- live with someone who has a weakened immune system.

Frontline health and social care workers can also get a flu vaccine through their employer.

# **Pregnancy Focus**

If you're pregnant, having the #flu vaccine will protect you and your baby from flu complications this winter.

It's especially important during pregnancy, as flu infections increase the risk of babies being premature or stillborn.

#### **Child Focus**

5 reasons to vaccinate your child with the free #flu vaccine this autumn:

- 1. protects against more serious problems such as bronchitis and pneumonia
- 2. it helps to protect you, and vulnerable friends and family
- 3. no injections needed! For most children, it's a quick nasal spray
- 4. the vaccine has an excellent safety record
- 5. you're less likely to need to take time off work

The flu vaccine is free for children aged 2 to 16 and those with certain health conditions.
